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## Participant Rights

- You have the right to be treated with kindness and respect, no matter your race, religion, family background, if you served in the military, if you are married or not, their gender, who you love, how old you are, or if you have a disability.
- You have the right to follow your own religion, as long as it doesn't take away other people's rights.
- You don't have to join in any religious activity if you don't want to.
- You have the right to get services in a place that is easy to reach and doesn't have obstacles.
- You have the right to be able to get the help you need if you have trouble seeing, hearing, moving, speaking, understanding English, or if you have different cultural needs.
- The right to be provided with a certified interpreter by telephone and materials in your own language for free.
- The right to be safe from punishment or paybacks for speaking up.
- The right to be free from being isolated or physically restrained.
- The right to have your health information kept private and safe by the organization.
- The right to get complete information about your treatment options, including any alternatives or treatments you can do yourself.
- You have the right to pick a qualified mental health provider when one is available and needed for your care.
- You have the right to get a copy of the steps for making a complaint or grievance.
- The right to share a complaint or concern about any part of your care, either by speaking or writing.
- The right to make or change an advanced directive that explains your choices and wishes for your health care.
- The right to ask for and get a copy of your medical record and ask for changes or corrections if needed.
- The right to be safe from sexual harassment and from being taken advantage of in any way, including physically or financially.
- The right to help create your own service plan and get a copy if you want one.
- The right to know about all the services that are available to you.
